

Dr. Baughman is Professor of Medicine at the University of Cincinnati. After completing undergraduate training at Yale University, he received his medical degree from Case Western Reserve School of Medicine. He joined the Internal Medicine staff at the University of Cincinnati after completing both an Internal Medicine residency and fellowship training in pulmonary diseases at the University of Cincinnati. His major research interests include: the treatment of sarcoidosis and bronchoalveolar lavage. Along with his long time collaborator Dr. Elyse Lower, he has developed several novel treatments for sarcoidosis, including methotrexate, thalidomide, leflunomide, and infliximab. Current studies include treatments for pulmonary fibrosis, sarcoidosis associated fatigue and pulmonary hypertension due to sarcoidosis. He is editor of *Sarcoidosis, Vasculitis, and Diffuse Lung Disease* and *Current Opinion of Pulmonary Disease*. He is on the editorial board of multiple subspecialty journals, and his publications include over 300 original papers and over 100 review articles and/or book chapters. He has edited several books on sarcoidosis, pulmonary hypertension, and interstitial lung disease.
